CELEBRATING OUR 125TH ANNIVERSARY

On the evening of Monday, October 3, 1898, Robert Gray Dodge inaugurated the Department of Law at the Boston YMCA with a course in Property. Teaching in a new, evening law program to a class of 30 students, Dodge had no way of knowing that his lecture was to launch the founding of Northeastern University, ultimately a global leader in higher education.

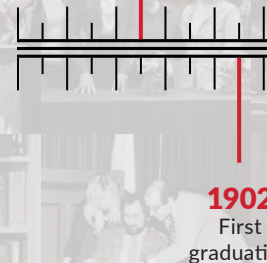

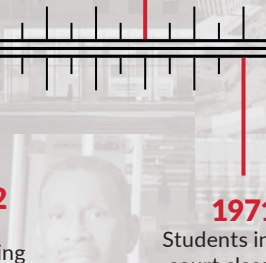

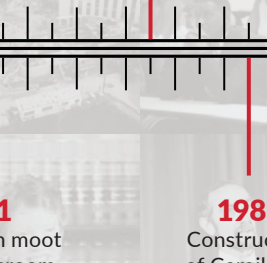

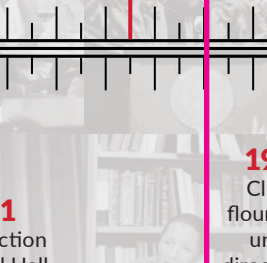

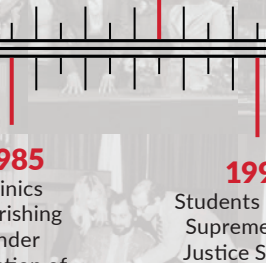

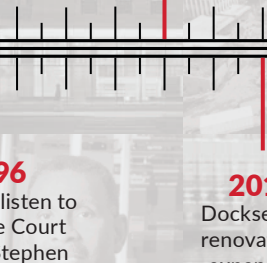
