It quickly became clear to me that this is one of the hardest decisions he has ever had to make, and I immediately wanted to do my part to help our new president, our students, and our College through this time. **This is why I write to you today. Oxy needs our help.**

Like many of you, Oxy was my first home away from home. In 1985, I came on an F-1 student visa from Hong Kong to this exciting place – the quintessential California college campus. It did not take long for me to develop my new life through my classes in music and the core curriculum, through my friends, and Glee Club. My brother Henry joined me the next year to study mathematics and play violin with the Occidental-Caltech Orchestra.

Oxy will forever be a place I call home, and today our home is facing one of the greatest challenges in its 133-year history. With residence halls empty and scores of first-years deferring admission, the tuition and room and board revenue that Oxy relies on to support our students is down significantly. At the same time, Oxy is still committed to meeting the full demonstrated financial need of each student and providing a high-touch liberal arts experience. This brings me great pride, but also a sense of urgency.
